Our Service Model

Our Adult Care Home Learning Disability model delivers tailored care, support and accommodation for adults with learning disabilities and/or autism, including those who may also be living with physical disabilities, dementia or sensory impairments.

From everyday support through to more specialised services, we provide a holistic approach that includes personal care, medication management and health and wellbeing and emotional support, ensuring residents maintain their dignity and independence.

We work in collaboration with the local authority, health services and other professionals to ensure a well-rounded approach to meeting an individuals' needs.

Our adult care home can be a home for life if someone chooses, or a step toward a more independent setting.

By giving just enough support, we do things with residents rather than for them, to maintain and enhance independence.



Eligibility & referrals

We accept referrals from local authorities. Residents must be aged 18 or over and be eligible under the Care Act.

We carry out comprehensive assessments to gain a deep understanding of support needs and preferences. We can visit individuals in their current place of residence to do this and with consent, involve any important people in the person's life to participate in the assessment process.

The weekly care home fee covers accommodation, meals and refreshments, personal care, laundry, cleaning and utility costs as well as access to on-site facilities and activities.

A financial assessment conducted by the local authority will determine whether the resident is required to pay a contribution.

Outcome-focused support

We offer structured routines and engaging activities to encourage residents to develop their skills and maintain their wellbeing.

We support people to dream big by identifying what they wish to achieve alongside their support needs and by developing person-centred plans to enable positive outcomes.



Maximising independence

We explore how technology, adaptations and active support can enhance everyday life.



Health and wellbeing

We support residents to access GPs, nurses and other healthcare professionals for regular check-ups and medical care.



Companionship and social interaction

Residents are encouraged to participate in group activities in the home to reduce loneliness and promote wellbeing. Family and friends are welcome to visit, and we facilitate a range of opportunities for social interaction to help residents maintain a good social life.



Community inclusion

We arrange community activities and outings to help residents build connections, participate in meaningful activities and contribute to their community.



Meet our team

Our team of Support Workers is committed and experienced in delivering person-centred and outcome focused care.

Residents are provided support in line with their assessed needs. Support teams are fully trained around any specific support needs, such as choking risks, epilepsy and moving and handling.

The team, led by a CQC Registered Manager, provides a culture of openness, trust, dignity and respect. With high staff retention, we pride ourselves on offering consistent high quality support.
